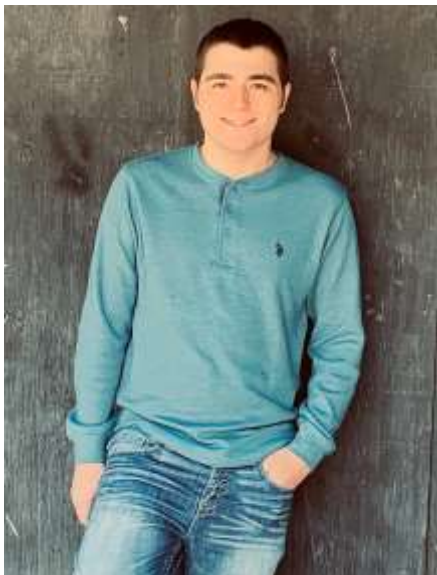
Adora Lee Campbell
